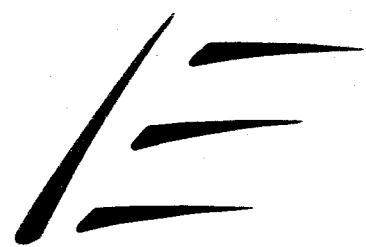


# Society for Endocrinology
